**ALYSON PITMAN GILES, FACHE, INSTALLED AS  
CHAIRMAN OF AMERICAN COLLEGE OF HEALTHCARE EXECUTIVES**

**CHICAGO, March 17, 2007**—Alyson Pitman Giles, FACHE, president and chief executive officer of CMC Healthcare System and Catholic Medical Center, Manchester, N.H., has assumed the office of Chairman of the American College of Healthcare Executives, an international professional society of more than 30,000 healthcare executives.

Giles was installed today at the Council of Regents Meeting during ACHE's 50th Congress on Healthcare Leadership in New Orleans. She received the gavel from William C. Schoenhard, FACHE, outgoing ACHE Chairman.

As Chairman, Giles will serve the second part of a three-year term in ACHE's consecutive chairmanship offices: Chairman-Elect, Chairman and Immediate Past-Chairman.

Before being named Chairman-Elect, Giles served as an ACHE Governor from 2004 to 2006 and as the ACHE Regent for New Hampshire from 1999 to 2003.

Giles has been president and chief executive officer of CMC Healthcare System since 2002 and president and chief executive officer of Catholic Medical Center since 1999. CMC Healthcare System is the home of the New England Heart Institute, a two-time top-100 heart program, and also includes a 330-bed acute-care hospital, a physician practice subsidiary and an ambulatory surgery partnership with 30 surgeons.

Before her current position, Giles served as executive vice president and chief operating officer of Optima Healthcare. Prior to that, Giles served as president and chief executive officer of New London Hospital, N.H.; president and chief executive officer of Lake Shore Hospital in Manchester, N.H.; first vice president for Specialty Services at CMC; and vice president for Clinical Services at the Easter Seal Society for New Hampshire and Vermont in Manchester.

Giles was named the 2005 Business Leader of the Year by *Business NH Magazine* and New Hampshire's Most Remarkable Woman in Healthcare in 2002 by *New Hampshire Magazine*. She also was named Distinguished Citizen of the Year for 2002 by the Daniel Webster Boy Scout Council. Giles has served on numerous college, foundation, telecommunications and insurance boards; was chairman of the Bishop's Charitable Assistance Fund Campaign in 2005; and served in leadership positions for several associations, including president of the New Hampshire Association of Healthcare Executives, director of the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce, director of the Advisory Board of the University of New Hampshire–Manchester, director of the New Hampshire Hospital Association and director of the Northeast Health Care Quality Foundation and many others.

Board certified in healthcare management and an ACHE Fellow, Giles received her master's degree in human services administration from Southern New Hampshire University and her bachelor's degree, graduating Magna Cum Laude, from Tufts University.
