CHRISTOPHER D. VAN GORDER, FACHE, APPOINTED TO AMERICAN COLLEGE OF HEALTHCARE EXECUTIVES BOARD OF GOVERNORS

CHICAGO, June 21, 2006—Christopher D. Van Gorder, FACHE, president and chief executive officer, Scripps Health, San Diego, has been appointed to serve on the Board of Governors of the American College of Healthcare Executives, an international professional society of 30,000 healthcare executives.

Van Gorder was appointed to fill the vacancy created by the election of Alyson Pitman Giles to Chairman-Elect in March. He will serve until 2007, representing ACHE affiliates on ACHE's Board of Governors, the authority that oversees ACHE operations and member services.

Van Gorder has served as president and chief executive officer of Scripps Health since 2000. Scripps Health is a not-for-profit, integrated healthcare delivery system with five acute-care hospitals, Scripps Clinic, an ambulatory care network and more than 2,600 affiliated physicians. Van Gorder's responsibilities include all functions of the \$1.6 billion corporation.

From 1999 to 2000, Van Gorder served Scripps Health as chief of Healthcare Operations. Prior to joining Scripps Health, he served Memorial Health Services (MHS) in Long Beach, Calif., as executive vice president of MHS (1996-1999), chief executive officer of Long Beach Memorial Medical Center (1997-1999) and president and chief executive officer of Anaheim Memorial Medical Center (1995-1997).

Prior to being appointed an ACHE Governor, Van Gorder was on ACHE's Membership Committee and served on the Regents Advisory Council. He currently is regional policy board member for the American Hospital Association, board member of the California Hospital Association, and editorial board member of The Governance Institute in addition to several local leadership roles. Van Gorder also was appointed to the U.S. National Commission for the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization in December 2004 and California Governor's Commission on Emergency Medical Services in March 2006. He is a Reserve Lieutenant in command of the Medical Unit of the San Diego Sheriff's Department Search and Rescue Bureau and serves the University of Southern California as assistant clinical professor and Health Advisory Board member in the School of Public Policy and Planning, Residency Advisory Board member, clinical mentor and residency preceptor.

Board certified in healthcare management and an ACHE Fellow, Van Gorder received his master's degree in public health and health services administration from the University of Southern California and his bachelor's degree from California State University, Los Angeles. He completed the Program for Healthcare System Chief Executive Officers of the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania.
