Stacey, PhD, FACHE**, are recipients of the Gold Medal Award; and **Nicholas R. Tejeda, FACHE**, is the recipient of the Robert S. Hudgens Memorial Award for Young Healthcare Executive of the Year.

Capozzalo is also a member of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement and serves on its audit and compliance committee.

Stacey, managing director, Navigant, Chicago, served as ACHE Chairman from 2011 to 2012, on the Board of Governors from 2007 to 2010 and on the Council of Regents from 2004 to 2007. Stacey also was the 1999 recipient of the Robert S. Hudgens Memorial Award for Young Healthcare Executive of the Year. Stacey is the current appointee of the United States Secretary of Commerce as the chairman of the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award Board of Overseers, and is chairman of the CEO Circle of the International Hospital Federation, Geneva, Switzerland.

Capozzalo and Stacey will receive their awards Monday, March 27, 2017, at the Opening Session during ACHE's 60th Congress on Healthcare Leadership.

The Robert S. Hudgens Memorial Award for Young Healthcare Executive of the Year honors outstanding achievement in the field of healthcare management. The award is given to an exceptional healthcare executive who is younger than 40, is a Fellow of ACHE and holds a CEO or COO position in a healthcare organization.

Tejeda, CEO, The Hospitals of Providence Transmountain Campus, El Paso, Texas, is responsible for the development of the nation's newest teaching hospital, a collaboration with the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center El Paso, which opened Jan. 17, 2017. He also is a member of the American Hospital Association's Regional Policy Board No. 7 and the board of directors for the Institute for Diversity in Health Management. He was previously chairman of ACHE's Early Careerist Committee. He will receive his award on Tuesday, March 28, 2017, at the Malcolm T. MacEachern Memorial Lecture and Luncheon during ACHE's 60th Congress on Healthcare Leadership in Chicago.
